Dear St Nicholas of Myra Families,

Learning

Personalised Plans (PPs)

Thank you to the parents for making the time to work in partnership with the school and teachers for our children. This is an important time each year to have the conversation about specific goals. I would like to thank Miss Dobrucki for facilitating this time together.

NAPLAN

NAPLAN tests the sorts of skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life, such as reading, writing, spelling, grammar and numeracy. It is important to remember that NAPLAN is not about passing or failing, but about assessing learning progress. At the classroom level it is one of a number of important tools used by teachers to measure student progress.

This year we will be participating in NAPLAN Online tests. The testing period is from Tuesday 12 May until Friday 22 May. Please see the table below which explains when these tests will occur. NAPLAN Online tests will need to be taken in a specific order. Individual students are not permitted to sit the online tests after Friday 22 May 2020.

Test	Duration	Order	Details
Writing	Year 3: 40 minutes Year 5: 42 minutes	To be completed in the first two days	Year 3 students do a paper-based writing test on day one only. Students are provided with a 'writing stimulus' (sometimes called a 'prompt' – an idea or topic) and asked to write a response in a particular genre (narrative or persuasive writing).
Reading	Year 3: 45 minutes Year 5: 50 minutes	To be completed after the Writing test	Students read a range of informative, imaginative and persuasive texts and then answer related questions.
Language conventions	Year 3: 45 minutes. Year 5: 45 minutes	To be completed after the Reading test	This test includes spelling, grammar and punctuation.
Numeracy	Year 3: 45 minutes. Year 5: 50 minutes	To be completed after the Language Conventions test	This test includes number and algebra; measurement and geometry; and statistics and probability.

School Fees

Leaving Students

A term's notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable. The notice can be given any time during term for the next term. One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following year's enrolment, that is, the notice period of 10 school weeks will be waived in this circumstance.

The requirement for a term notice (10 school weeks) is recognition by the family of the commitment to assist with funding of the school by having their child take a place that could have been offered to another family. Unless the student is present for the August census or the student is able to be replaced mid-year, which is unlikely, the loss of the student will most certainly result in the loss of significant government funding. Thus a term notice provides the school with an opportunity to replace the student within the next term.

Special circumstances that would warrant a waiving of this notice, include;

- moving due to employment transfer
- sale of house
- the student has been offered full time employment (High School)
- the student has been offered an apprenticeship (High School)

Due Dates

School fees have been issued and Term 1 fees are due by 18 March 2020. If you have paid or set up an arrangement, thank you. If you wish to discuss setting up an arrangement or if you require assistance please do not hesitate to contact Rhonda Shirvington in the school office. All matters are treated with strict confidence.

- Term 1 due date is 18 March 2020
- Term 2 due date is 3 June 2020
- Term 3 due date is 26 August 2020

Cyber safety

Your child may not tell you if they are experiencing bullying behaviour online because of a fear it might make things worse for them or they may lose access to their devices and the internet.

Signs to watch for;

- being upset after using the internet or their mobile phone
- changes in personality, becoming more withdrawn, anxious, sad or angry
- lack of sleep
- appearing more lonely or distressed
- unexpected changes in friendship groups
- a decline in their school work
- changes in their sleep patterns
- avoidance of school or clubs
- a decline in their physical health
- becoming secretive about their online activities and mobile phone use

Some tips to ensure children's safety when using technology could include;

- turning off chat and messenger functions on ipads, phones, gaming systems and smart televisions
- having technology designated to certain areas of the house. e.g. lounge room
- no devices in the bedroom for younger children
- all screens off in bedrooms after a certain time for older children
- having set times for technology use e.g all family members switch off at dinner time
- discussing the apps and websites children are using
- all screens off at least one hour before planned bedtime
- devices charged overnight in a place your child cannot access
