200 Years of Catholic Education in Australia

In 2020, Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta celebrates 200 years of Australia's first Catholic school through continued commitment of growing opportunities of Catholic education for all.

The first Catholic school in this country opened in Parramatta in 1820 by a layman George Marley, Parramatta Marist Brothers. George became the first teacher working with the support of one of the first Catholic priests Fr John Therry. Together, they made school possible for the most disadvantaged. Later, the work of lay teachers would be supported and grown through the service of so many religious women and men. This work, this service, this belief in the role and place of Catholic Education in the lives of young people and their families, is now our work.

The Parish of St Nicholas of Myra is one of the oldest in the Sydney area. Established in 1852, St Nicholas is the oldest of three primary schools in the area. In 1879, Saint Mary MacKillop founded her first convent in NSW in Penrith and in 1880, the Sisters of St Joseph were given leadership of the school community.

Bishop Vincent reminded all leaders at a System Leaders Day that our pioneers were "fundamentally meeting the great cultural challenges of their times" and "had the courage to launch into the deep. We stand on their shoulders and continue their spirit of missionary and innovative leadership."

At St Nicholas of Myra, we are tremendously proud of our Catholic heritage and are committed to celebrating and showcasing the faith, learning and achievements of students in our school. We are delighted about the teaching and learning that occurs in our learning spaces every day, as well as the contributions made to our local communities, in particular the more vulnerable and disadvantaged members.

Two hundred years of continuous Catholic Education is an impressive achievement. We will celebrate 200 years of Catholic Education with a special school celebration later in the year.

School Fees - Leaving Students

A term's notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable. The notice can be given any time during term for the next term. One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following year's enrolment, that is, the notice period of 10 school weeks will be waived in this circumstance.

The requirement for a term's notice (10 school weeks) is recognition by the family of the commitment to assist with funding of the school by having their child take a place that could have been offered to another family.

Unless the student is present for the August census or the student is able to be replaced mid-year, which is unlikely, the loss of the student will most certainly result in the loss of significant government funding. Thus a term notice provides the school with an opportunity to replace the student within the next term. Special circumstances that would warrant a waiving of this notice, include:

- Moving due to employment transfer
- Sale of house
- The student has been offered full time employment (High School)
- The student has been offered an apprenticeship (High School)

COVID-19 in NSW

A number of new and emerging clusters of COVID-19 have been identified in various areas across NSW. Given the ongoing situation, we all are encouraged to keep up to date with information and advice from <u>NSW Health</u> and the <u>NSW Government</u>. Even if you have the mildest of symptoms, it is recommended that you seek medical advice, self-isolate and get tested for COVID-19. <u>Symptoms of COVID-19</u> include, but are not limited to, fever, cough, shortness of breath, fatigue, runny nose, nausea and loss of appetite.

As you would be aware, the NSW and Victoria border closed as of 12:01am 8 July. NSW residents returning from Victoria after this time must have a permit to enter NSW and are now required to self-isolate for 14 days on returning.

With Term 3 commencing on 20 July 2020, we are all reminded about practising good hygiene and to ensure that social distancing is adhered to for adults. Some practical things to consider are:

- maintain social distancing of 1.5m particularly where you may interact with adults such as the car park etc
- wash hands frequently with soap and water
- cover your nose and mouth (using a flexed elbow or tissue) when you cough or sneeze with your elbow
- no large gatherings
- stay home if you are unwell

Thank you for your continued patience as we make adjustments to keep and care for ourselves and one another by being proactive in getting tested, keeping unwell children at home as well as our good hygiene practices.

Birthdays

As we would like to continue to celebrate the individual particularly on their birthday, if you choose to send in something for their stage or friends, please ensure that these are store purchased and in individualserving portions (cupcakes, lamingtons, donuts - obviously keeping in mind we are a nut aware school) so there is reduced risk to our children. This is a temporary measure during COVID-19. We will keep you updated to any further changes.

Sport in 2020

Towards the end of Term 2, staff from all schools have been working closely with the CEDP and NSW Government to work out solutions for sporting days in 2020. After careful consideration, the 2020 School Zone and Diocesan Athletics Carnivals have been cancelled. Gala days that were scheduled for Term 2 (Girls and Boys Soccer) have been cancelled.

Gala days scheduled for Terms 3 and 4 will go ahead with strict guidelines and for Stage 3 students only.

At this stage on health advice from the NSW government and the CEDP, no parents are permitted to assist before or on the day or attend as spectators. Unfortunately, we are not able to have parents coaching our teams prior to the gala days as well. This would mean parents are required to drop off and pick up students at the set times.

All gala days are subject to change on the advice from the NSW government and the CEDP.

Students will be selected for teams based on a strict criteria with the Stage 3 teachers working in conjunction with Mr Simpson. Students will be selected on their skills, teamwork and effort during team tryouts. Upon gaining selection into the team, students must be safe, respectful and a learner at all times to be able to represent the school. If it is decided that a student or students who have been selected are not following the school expectations, another student or students will be invited to take their place.

Advice on the Term 4 Swim Program and Swimming Carnival will be communicated once the information is available.

Essentially, the 'Kiss and Drive' zone allows for only a two minute period where a vehicle can be stationary and children may be dropped off or picked up

- The driver or adult passenger **MUST NOT** leave the vehicle.
- Children must vacate the car from the left hand side (footpath)
- Avoid putting school bags in the boot
- Make sure your child's school bag is packed and organised and zipped up before you leave home
- Do not park across our neighbours driveways

We are very fortunate to have a well developed 'Kiss and Drive' zone that operates smoothly when all concerned follow correct procedure

Attendance Absent Notes

If your child is absent, a reminder to send a Skoolbag notification to explain their absence. If no note has been received within 7 days, this is automatically marked as an unexplained absence and is not able to be changed.

What will happen if my child is unwell at school?

NSW Health advice states that children who become ill while they are at school should be sent home as soon as possible. In the event that your child presents unwell at school, parents and carers will be contacted.

If your child becomes sick at school, they will be sent to the sick bay where parents will be called to collect their child. If staff or students at school are experiencing symptoms compatible with COVID-19 (e.g. fever, cough, sore throat, runny nose, fatigue, shortness of breath), a temperature check will be conducted using a forehead thermometer provided by the CEDP. Anything at or above 38 degrees will require students or staff to be isolated in an appropriate space and to be collected by a parent/carer as soon as possible. We ask that you collect your child in a timely fashion.

If your child is sick they should not be at school until they are well.

Protect yourself from viruses



Clean your hands with soap and water, or hand sanitiser.



Cover your nose and mouth when you cough or speeze



Avoid close contact with anyone with cold or flu-like symptoms.



Stay home if you are sick.
