General News

It has come to our attention that the procedures around dropping of and collecting of children from the **'Kiss and Drive'** zone are not being adhered to and are causing some concern in relation to the safety and convenience of our children and families

Essentially, the 'Kiss and Drive' zone allows for only a two minute period where a vehicle can be stationary and children may be dropped off or picked up:

- The driver MUST NOT leave the vehicle
- Children must vacate the car from the left hand side (footpath)
- Move car seat position to the left hand side of your car
- Avoid putting school bags in the boot
- Make sure your child's school bag is packed, organised and zipped up before you leave home
- Do not park across our neighbours driveways

We are very fortunate to have a well developed 'Kiss and Drive' zone that operates smoothly when all concerned follow the correct procedure.

2021 Kindergarten Enrolments

In the interest of everyone's health and safety, the usual process of a welcome interview with the child, parent/s and the Principal is unable to take place at the moment. Here is the current process for you to follow:

- If questions arise from the application the Enrolment Officer or Leadership Delegate will make a phone call to clarify
- A letter of acceptance or recommendation will be sent to you via the post.

2021 is an exciting year and we have currently received 27 applications which is fantastic and we usually only accept 31. So please act today, don't delay!

Leaving Students

A term's notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable. The notice can be given any time during term for the next term. One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following year's enrolment, that is, the notice period of 10 school weeks will be waived in this circumstance.

The requirement for a term's notice (10 school weeks) is recognition by the family of the commitment to assist with funding of the School by having their child take a place that could have been offered to another family. Unless the student is present for the August census or the student is able to be replaced mid-year, which is unlikely, the loss of the student will most certainly result in the loss of significant government funding. Thus a term notice provides the school with an opportunity to replace the student within the next term. Special circumstances that would warrant a waiving of this notice, include:

- Moving due to employment transfer
- Sale of house
- The student has been offered full time employment
- The student has been offered an apprenticeship

Semester One Reports and Zoom Student Led Conferences

Thank you for all of your support and flexibility as we conferenced via zoom and reported on learning during this first half of the year.

I came across this article from Alexandra the creator of Big Life Journal and thought this was apt to share this with you at this time of the school year when we receive a report and have valuable conversations about our children's learning progress.

How can you help your child understand that **what THEY think of themselves and their work is WAY more important than what others think of them?**

You can do so by helping them develop *internal validation so they stop seeking validation from other people.*

Easier said than done, right?

Our human's primitive brain is wired to seek validation from others. We want to be accepted by the "tribe" so that we're safe and protected from external threats.

Nevertheless, you can make a big difference on how much your child values their own opinion of themselves and their work.

Begin by paying attention to how you give them feedback.

Next time, instead of immediately jumping to praise or even criticism about something your child has done, ASK them questions instead:

"What do YOU think you did well?" "What do you think YOU could have done better?" "How did YOU feel when you were making this?" "How does your work make YOU feel?"

And if your child answers with "I don't' know," it's a great reason to continue to encourage them to self-reflect.

When we ask our children for their own assessment instead of immediately jumping in with our opinion, we're giving them a *chance to self-reflect and self-evaluate*.

This helps them develop internal validation, which is the most important voice to be listening to and nourishing.

Personal Development, Health and Physical Education (PDHPE) - new syllabus

This year St Nicholas of Myra began working with the new **New South Wales Education Standards Authority** (NESA) and **Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA)** PDHPE curriculum. The key three strands of the new curriculum are; (1) Health, Wellbeing and Relationships, (2) Movement Skill and Performance and (3) Healthy Safe and Active Lifestyles. The new curriculum has a few changes in content for different stages of learning. One change we would like to bring to your attention is within the Health, Wellbeing and Relationships strand (NESA).

These changes are also reflected not just in ACARA but NESA as well. Below are statements from the ACARA website, they show the progression from Early Stage 1 to Stage 3 when learning about how our bodies grow and change.

Early Stage 1 will name parts of the body and describe how their body is growing and changing.

Stage 1 will describe physical and social changes that occur as children grow older and discuss how family and community acknowledge these changes.

Stage 2 will learn and discuss physical, social and emotional changes that occur as individuals get older and explore how these changes impact on how they think and feel about themselves and different situations.

Stage 3 investigates resources and strategies to manage changes and transitions associated with puberty understanding that individuals experience changes associated with puberty at different times, with differing levels of intensity and with different responses. They research and identify age-appropriate text and web-based resources to enhance understanding of changes associated with puberty examining the range of products available to manage the physical changes associated with puberty.

Positive Behaviour Support for Learning

Congratulations to Stage 1 for winning the Playground Behaviour Award for the last 2 weeks. Our focus until the end of this term has been; "to be in the right place playing non-contact activities at playtime." Students have come up with various alternative games to play during this time to ensure safe play is maintained. Well done to both students and teachers in responding to this playground initiative!

Attendance- Punctuality

Regular and punctual attendance at school is essential to assist children to establish positive attendance habits. Schools, in partnership with parents, are responsible for promoting the regular attendance of students.

The school day commences at 9am at St Nicholas of Myra. The morning music begins at 8:57am and concludes with the bell at 9am. We are currently not having assemblies due to Covid-19 restrictions so students are entering their classrooms and beginning their learning at 9am.



Arriving at school before the bell allows students to experience positive interactions with their peers through play in the morning and develop morning routines which can reduce the anxiety of coming to school for some students.

Arriving late means that students are missing part of their literacy block, instructions have not been heard and routines have not been set in motion. As a consequence, students can find themselves taking longer to settle into their learning.

Please ensure that students are on time at school every day. Should unforeseen circumstances prevent you from arriving on time, please ensure that children are signed in at the office by an adult.

Smartwatches and Fitbits at School

Smartwatches and fitbits are amazing pieces of technology that we can use to make our lives better. They offer a wide range of features and functions. Many students have started wearing these devices to school on a regular basis. Like any piece of technology at school, we must learn to use them in the appropriate way.

Appropriate use of smartwatches and fitbits at school;
using it as a watch during class time e.g. check time, date

- checking fitness activity such as steps and heart rate during break times only
- setting a timer to complete an activity
- turning off all notifications and alerts for watch apps

Inappropriate use of smartwatches and fitbits at school;

- checking fitness activity such as steps and heart rate during learning time
- using features other than to tell the time or read the date e.g. voice recording, using apps, setting alarms, using music services
- checking alerts, and notifications
- anything that is in breach of any the CEDP and school policies

No smartwatches or fitbits with **access to cellular networks** are permitted at school. This includes all watches and fitbits that have access to message, chat and communication features either through the phone or wifi.

Any reported misuse during school will be investigated and communicated following the school's PBS4L procedures. The final decision will be with the Principal, Leadership or the appointed Delegate of the day.
