
St Mary Mackillop Liturgy

Attending Mass or Other Services at St Nicholas of Myra Church

Please find below the latest information from the Diocese of Parramatta and specifically St Nicholas of Myra Parish in regards to attending the Church. This is relevant for families attending Mass, Sacraments such as Reconciliation, Holy Communion or any service at the Church.

Dear Parishioners

As you will have seen, NSW Health, supported by the Premier of NSW is highly recommending everyone in NSW to wear masks in any situation with the potential for COVID-19 transmission. Places of worship have been mentioned specifically.

We are therefore officially recommending all worshippers in the Diocese of Parramatta to wear a mask to Mass. This would be as people arrive on parish grounds, during Mass or the service and afterwards as they leave. During Communion, the mask may be removed, but it should be in place at all other times.

Priests and readers who cannot wear a mask to conduct their duties at Mass, must observe appropriate social distancing at all times.

Masks don't replace distancing or hygiene. If you're making a cloth one, aim for three layers, with a water-repellent outside layer.

Have a few for when you're out. Put the used ones in a plastic bag and wash at home later. Handle them safely – like you would a used tissue or hanky. No masks for children under 2 yrs – they're a choking hazard.



On consideration of the most recent NSW Health advice, the Diocese of Parramatta highly recommends all worshippers at Masses in the Diocese to wear a mask to, during and from Mass and other services.

We understand the inconvenience that masks may pose, but the health of our parishioners and the wider community is our highest concern. We sincerely thank you for understanding, and for playing your part in keeping our community safe.

General News

School Fees

A term's notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable. The notice can be given any time during term for the next term. One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following year's enrolment, that is, the notice period of 10 school weeks will be waived in this circumstance.

The requirement for a term's notice (10 school weeks) is recognition by the family of the commitment to assist with funding of the School by having their child take a place that could have been offered to another family. Unless the student is present for the August census or the student is able to be replaced mid-year, which is unlikely, the loss of the student will most certainly result in the loss of significant government funding. Thus a term's notice provides the school with an opportunity to replace the student within the next term. Special circumstances that would warrant a waiving of this notice, include:

- Moving due to employment transfer
- Sale of house
- The student has been offered full time employment (High School)
- The student has been offered an apprenticeship (High School)

We would prefer if possible that all payment transactions be cash free e.g. Book Club and School Fees.
