Term 4 Week 1

Dear St Nicholas of Myra Families,

This year marks the 10th anniversary of the canonisation of Mary MacKillop (Saint Mary of the Cross). Our school was fortunate to have four teachers, a student and parent attend the Canonisation in Rome 10 years ago. St Nicholas of Myra was the first Josephite school established in the Diocese in 1852 and known to have been visited by Mary. Mary worked in the community, reaching out to the poor to raise them up through the service of education. Our school flag was taken to Rome and hung proudly at all the gatherings of Australian Pilgrims. Mrs Khoury was one of the teachers who

attended the canonisation in Rome and remembers the day fondly.



"I remember waking up early in the morning and arriving at a packed St Peter's Basilica. We were all so excited as we waited a few hours in line to get to our seats. As the Pope drove past, it all became real for me that we were about to be part of something truly special. I remember seeing the image of Mary Mackillop hanging from St Peter's Basilica and feeling so proud to be an Australian working in a school that was started by the Sisters of St Joseph. We waved the school flag proudly as Mary's name was called out and she was officially canonised a Saint. After this celebration we went with all the other Australian pilgrims to the church of St Peter and St Paul where there was an Australian gathering. The church was full of Aussies proudly professing their faith. It is something that has never left me and I feel truly honoured to be a part of it all."

The theme for the 10th anniversary of the canonisation of St Mary MacKillop is "Take Fresh Courage" a quote written by Mary MacKillop on 21 May 1877. Over the past few months many of us have had to take courage during this constantly changing world. Whether it was the courage to use online platforms like Zoom for the first time, go back out in public after isolating ourselves or even the courage to say I am not ok today. We have been challenged to find new ways to live, work and play. What life will be after this pandemic is unknown and this is where we need to draw upon our faith and courage just as Mary did during her life. Mary wrote, 'Let us pray for the ever dear Will of our good God to be done, and in the end we shall see what peace and happiness will result from all our sorrows', she had complete trust and faith in a God whose love sees us through every evil.



Mary is a beacon of hope for our world and through her canonisation we were all invited to make a difference in the world. As one writer said, we can ask ourselves, "What aspect of her life can I embody so that, together, we can be a living portrait of her in our world?"

School Fees Statements

Statements are being sent with a due date of the 18 December 2020. As always, if you are experiencing any hardship in paying school fees, please contact Rhonda Shirvington in the school office and we will endeavour to assist you with payment options.

School fees - Leaving Students

A term's notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable. The notice can be given any time during term for the next term. One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following year's enrolment, that is, the notice period of 10 school weeks will be waived in this circumstance.

The requirement for a term's notice (10 school weeks) is recognition by the family of the commitment to assist with funding of the School by having their child take a place that could have been offered to another family. Unless the student is present for the August census or the student is able to be replaced mid-year, which is unlikely, the loss of the student will most certainly result in the loss of significant government funding. Thus a term notice provides the school with an opportunity to replace the student within the next term. Special circumstances that would warrant a waiving of this notice, include:

- Moving due to employment transfer
- Sale of house
- · The student has been offered full time employment
- The student has been offered an apprenticeship

Changes to School Fee Structure for 2021

Catholic Education Department Parramatta have made a decision to slightly alter the fee structure for 2021. The Family Levy had been merged with the Resource Fee, so the Family Levy will no longer be evident on your fee statement. The benefit of this is that, due to Covid-19, there will be no increase in diocesan tuition fees or the building levy and therefore you will find that the total school fees increase is within the bounds of normal annual increases. For most families, this will have little or no impact on the amount of fees being charged, however some families with three or more students at St Nicholas will find there will be a slight increase due to the combination of these fees.

2020 Excursion Levy

As COVID-19 has changed our ability to attend some excursions we have been able to provide incursions for all stages this year. Early Stage 1 and Stage 1 normally attend a farm or zoo experience; instead they had the farm visit including a sausage sizzle. Stage 2 usually visit Nepean Lakes; instead they had a Science incursion which included a sausage sizzle. Stage 3 were able to experience their excursion of Teen Ranch just before COVID-19 occurred. Our other whole school events still occurred, for example; Life Education, World of Maths and Musica Viva. At this point in time we are gathering Risk Assessments for the Swimming Program, Carnival and Bus Transport. We are able to, as advised by the NSW Government and CEDP Health Advice to attend these important excursions. Further details regarding parent attendance at these events will be communicated over the coming weeks as further advice is given.

Uniform






Religious Education

This term all Stages in our school will be working with a new learning cycle during Religious Education.



The following are the overarching questions the students will be engaging with this term:

Early Stage 1: How is God the Father present to all in our world?

This learning cycle encourages students to develop an understanding of the presence of God in their lives and to realise they are uniquely wonderful.

Stage 1: Why do we belong to communities?

This learning cycle asks students to appreciate the importance of belonging to a faith community for human flourishing.

Stage 2: How is God present in my life?

This learning cycle invites students to begin grappling with a Trinitarian theology.

Stage 3: How do we find hope and joy?

This learning cycle challenges students to articulate their own hope and joy, while at the same time having empathy for the hopes and joys of others, particularly the marginalised and the most vulnerable.

I encourage you to ask your child about what they are learning in Religion as we journey together with our new curriculum.




Parent Survey






Student Survey

School Travel for 2021



2021 school travel applications are now open

Applications for student travel in 2021 opened from Monday 12 October 2020.

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass for 2021 can now <u>apply</u> online. A new application should be submitted if a student is applying for a school travel pass for the first time or requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who have changed school/campus, changed address, repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should re-apply or update their details.

*Applications must be completed by the student's parent or legal guardian if the student is aged under 16 years. Students 16 years and over must complete the application form themselves.

Where there is a change of distance eligibility based on a student's grade, the system will automatically update a student's entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new eligibility criteria, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If a student needs to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2020 to ensure that current student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card remains valid. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2020, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2021.

Students residing in Rural and Regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the commencement of the new school year from their nominated operator, this may be distributed via the school or sent direct to their address. Note: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/Parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

New Concession Entitlement Cards

Transport for NSW will be replacing the below cards with Transport Concession Entitlement Cards (TCEC) from October 2020:

- Senior Secondary Student Concession Card (16 years and over) also used by Mature Secondary Students (18 years and over), Distance Education Students and Home School Students
- Proof of Age card (when a student under 16 years of age looks older)
- Boarder Rail Pass.

All previous cards will be valid until they expire. Students who require a Transport Concession Entitlement Card should speak with their school administration staff.
