The Ascension of the Lord Matthew 28:16-20

PMeCollection

Just a friendly reminder to support students with their reading, the school has subscribed to and will be using the PM eCollection. Students are assigned texts by their classroom teachers at their instructional level and over the weeks build a library of texts that they will be able to read independently. <u>For Weeks 5 and 6 - Kiss and Ride will need to be staggered to assist</u> <u>social distancing;</u>

• Infant children (Kindergarten, Year 1 and Year 2) and their siblings only are to be picked up at **2:50pm**. *Please be aware the gates will be closed from* **2:45pm**.

• Primary will be at **3:10pm-** Please do not arrive before this time to assist with the flow of traffic.

Changes to Kiss and Ride may need to continue until the end of term but you will be advised in the coming weeks.

Transport

With the recent announcement of social distancing on bus services, Busways has clarified to us that school services are not affected and will not have limited capacity. Transport for NSW and Busways have increased cleaning measures on board bus services and will continue to monitor transport usage to support students travelling safely to and from school.

The Busways' policy is that no school student will be left behind and as such, school students will be given priority over other passengers on regular route services even if this means a service goes over physical distancing capacity. All services will continue to operate to a normal timetable until advised otherwise. Students will still be required to tap on and off with their Opal card when boarding.
