COVID-19 Cancelled Excursion/activities

With the current uncertainty around whether excursions/activities will go ahead for the remainder of the year, please understand that it is hard to know when to make the decision to cancel an event. We can still make adjustments for the Information Statements we send in Term 4. Where events are held in Term 4 after these statements have been produced, we will make the adjustment prior to issuing Instalment 1 2022 Statements.

Reversal/Refunds

The reversal of cancelled excursions/activities together with accounts paid in full has led to these accounts now being in credit. If an account is for a continuing student, the credit will be applied to 2022 fees. For students moving to another school within the Diocese, the credit balance will be moved to the new account.

Term 4 Information Statements will be sent with a due date of 18 November 2021. This is a week later than what was scheduled as part of the 2021 School Fee Billing Schedule.


Stage 2 Science Incursion Fun Day!

On Tuesday 12 October, Stage 2 enjoyed a day of science learning to tie in with their Science Unit about 'States of Matter'. 2021 NAPLAN CELEBRATING our SUCCESS!

In May this year, our Year 3 and Year 5 students participated in the 2021 Naplan assessments. Congratulations to all students for their hard work, persistence and resolve in completing the annual assessments!

St Nicholas of Myra has achieved some outstanding results which is a credit to the hard work of everyone in the school community.

Writing

An increase of 8.4% of students in the top two bands of Year 3 Writing and 14.8 % increase in Year 5 in the top two bands.

Three Year 3 students in the top 4% of the state.

Year 5 average growth well exceeded the NSW state average by 15.5 scale points.

Reading

An increase of 9% of students in the top two bands of Year 3 reading and 9.5% increase in Year 5 in the top two bands.

Year 5 average growth well exceeded the NSW state average by 19.7 scale points.

Language Conventions - Grammar and Punctuation/ Spelling

Grammar and Punctuation

An increase of 7% of students in the top two bands of Year 3 Language Convention - Grammar and Punctuation and 6% increase in Year 5 in the top two bands.

Year 5 average growth well exceeded the NSW state average by 17.8 scale points.

Spelling

An increase of 15.4% of students in the top two bands of Year 3 Language Convention- Spelling and 9.6% increase in Year 5 in the top two bands.


Year 5 growth well exceeded the NSW state average by 27.8 scale points.

Numeracy

Year 3 and Year 5 both maintained the percentage of students in the top two bands and shifted student results from the bottom two bands to the middle bands.

Year 5 average growth well exceeded the NSW state average by 17.2 scale points.
