Dear St Nicholas of Myra Families,

Welcome to Term 3; we hope you are all well and staying safe! This is not the start we were hoping for and we look forward to seeing our students on site and hear their laughter as soon as possible.

This term's newsletters will commemorate and help to broaden our knowledge of some less familiar Saints and today is the Feast of St Bonaventure! A saint we often do not hear of and potentially do not know about. He was a Bishop and Doctor born in Italy not far from Naples and Canonized in 1482.

After Bonaventure's death, someone wrote, "At the funeral there was much sorrow and tears; for the Lord had given him His grace, that all who saw him were filled with an immense love for him."

Bonaventure was baptised John. The story is told that when he was about four years old, he was deathly sick. His mother begged Francis of Assisi to come and cure her child. Francis simply touched the little boy and he was cured instantly. As an adult, Bonaventure entered under the Francisan order. From there he went to Paris, where he became a good friend of the great St Thomas of Aquinas. They both studied at the famous university of Paris. Eventually Bonaventure became professor of theology there.

After some years, Bonaventure became the Father General, the person in charge of the Francisan order. He held this position for seventeen years. He became a Bishop against his wish and then was appointed a Cardinal shortly before his death. He died at the Second Council of Lyons which he had prepared.

Bonaventure wrote many books about theology as well as a biography of St Francis Assisi. He wanted to teach everyone how to live closely with God. His spiritual life centered on Jesus, especially his passion and death.

In 1588 St Bonaventure was proclaimed "Seraphic Doctor" (meaning a Doctor of the Church). When Thomas Aquinas asked Bonaventure where he got his knowledge, Bonaventure pointed to the crucifix and said, "I study only the crucified one, Jesus Christ."

What can we learn from St Bonaventure? His devotion to Jesus and our faith. <u>He wanted to teach everyone how to live closely with God.</u> What a great and simple message during this time where we can feel alone; St Bonaventure, pray for us!




Library News


