### 2023 Kindergarten Enrolments and Catholic Schools Week Twilight Tours

Each year in Catholic Schools Week (CSW), we hold two twilights tours one at 4 pm and the other at 6pm. This year it will be held on **Monday 7 March 2022.**

COVID practices will be put in place and we recommend the wearing of masks during this tour. The Principal and Assistant Principal will be wearing masks.

Each person will be required to sign in and to register via a QR code. If you are unwell or have any symptoms we ask you to keep everyone safe by refraining from attending.

# Safety

## Road Safety

As school returns for 2022, please be reminded that road rules are in place to protect all road users including pedestrians and all motorists are expected to follow the road rules when dropping-off or picking-up students.

Thank you to the Parents/ Carers who take great care each day to drive and park safely around the school. Your diligence contributes greatly to the safe arrival and pick-up of our students. Here is a friendly reminder about what some general road signs mean.

To help us keep all of our children safe and if you know in advance that a relative/ friend is picking up your child/children and when possible please share the following Kiss 'n' Ride procedures.

*Essentially, the 'Kiss and Ride' zone allows for only a two minute period where a vehicle can be stationary and children may be dropped off or picked up. The driver **MUST NOT** leave the vehicle.*

## 9 School zones



A school zone is the area around a school with a speed limit of 40km/h. Between the *School Zone* and *End School Zone* signs, drivers must obey the school zone speed limit.

The school zone speed limit applies on NSW gazetted school days and during the times detailed on the school zone sign. School zone hours are normally 8:00am–9.30am and 2.30pm–4:00pm.

Pupil free days fall within the gazetted school days, thus school zones are operating and enforceable.

Some non-government schools do not operate on gazetted school days. Motorists should be aware that school zones still operate and are enforceable on these days.

There are a small number of schools with different school zone times – these will be detailed on the school zone sign.

KEEPING YOUR CHILDREN SAFE WHEN DROPPING OFF AND PICKING UP AT SCHOOL

| <b>PARKING</b><br><br>NEVER double park - which includes not blocking traffic while "waiting for a spot" in the NO parking area. | <b>CROSSING</b><br><br>NEVER park or stop across/on a pedestrian crossing.  | <b>NO U-TURNS</b><br><br>NEVER conduct a U-turn around school especially over double white centre lines or near a crossing.   |
| <b>PEDESTRIANS</b><br><br>Always use crossing facilities. Stop Look Listen and Think even when you have right of way.                                 | <b>BUCKLE UP</b><br><br>Children stay buckled up until the vehicle has stopped.   |
| <b>EXITING THE CAR</b><br><br>Make sure children use the kerb side door when getting in and out of a car.   | <b>BE READY</b><br><br>Children be ready at the gate and looking for their car at pick up time.   |

## COMMON PARKING OFFENCES

DON'T FORCE PEDESTRIANS ONTO THE ROADWAY...IT'S DANGEROUS!

Cars parking across driveways and footpaths are one of the most common obstructions to pedestrians.

All pedestrians using footpaths, especially those with disabilities, older people and the young, need an unobstructed, clear path of travel. Cars parked across the footpath force people onto the road, creating a dangerous situation.

### NATURE STRIP



PENALTIES FROM \$268

As a general rule, parking is not allowed on nature strips.

### DRIVEWAYS



PENALTIES FROM \$268

A driver must not park on or across (or partially across) a driveway blocking access to pedestrians and other vehicles.

### FOOTPATHS



PENALTIES FROM \$268

A driver must not stop on a footpath. This blocks pedestrians and other footpath areas as well as sight lines for vehicles using the roadway.

### DRIVEWAYS



PENALTIES FROM \$268

A driver must not park on or across (or partially across) a driveway blocking access to pedestrians and other vehicles.

### Sweat and Wet Weather

As the weather, at this point in time, does not seem to be following a season, we have the following Sweat and Wet weather procedures.

#### Sweat Weather

Sweat (Sun Safety) Weather procedure is multilayered which includes but is not limited to:

- wearing school hats in the playground
- playing in shaded areas, particularly during peak UVR times
- drinking plenty of water
- using 30+ broad-spectrum, water-resistant sunscreen
- at break times if it is determined to be too hot we keep children inside for play



#### Wet Weather

Wet (Water Safety) Weather procedure is multilayered and includes but is not limited to:

- wearing brightly coloured raincoats
- use of umbrellas
- if the ground is too wet/slippery to walk, play or eat (usually Fruit Break) we keep children inside for play
